



ACCOMPANYING DOCUMENTS FOR M127 APPLICATION

DOCUMENT	
1	Original birth certificate.
2	Original Certificate of Clean Criminal Record from the Republic of Cyprus (valid for 6 months).
3	Copy of valid residence permit.
4	Marriage certificate/Civil partnership agreement (where applicable).
5	Copy of valid passport or other travel document.
6	Copies of passport pages with arrival and departure stamps.
7	Detailed record of arrivals and departures to and from Cyprus.
8	Copies of announcements from two consecutive publications in a daily newspaper, notifying the submission of the naturalization application.
9	Certificate of success in a Greek language examination at level A2 or B1 or a high school diploma from a recognized Secondary Education Institution whose main language of instruction is Greek, or an academic degree in a program whose language of instruction is Greek, as applicable.
10	Certificate of success with a grade equal to or greater than 60%, in an evaluation examination of the Basic Elements of the Contemporary Political and Social Reality of Cyprus.
11	Proof of residence, such as title deed, purchase agreement and payment receipts, rental agreement and rent payment receipts, and utility bill payment receipts.
12	Proof of financial resources, such as payroll evidence, employment contract, social insurance, income tax, bank accounts, or any other evidence that can prove the applicant's income.
13	Individuals residing in the Republic for the purpose of being employed as highly skilled employees in companies determined by the Decision of the Council of Ministers, 92.018 should provide a certificate, either from the Company Facilitation Unit or from the Department of Population and Immigration, confirming that the company meets the criteria of Decision.
14	Two recent passport-sized photographs, certified by the Community Leader.
15	Copy of fee payment receipt (500 euros).
16	Copy of fee payment of 5.000 for accelerated examination of the application (only for highly skilled employees as determined by a relative Decision of Council of Ministers, and their family members)
